1. 8 April: French under d'Estrees occupy Wesel.
2. 12 June: Hanoverians under Duke of Cumberland retire from Bielefeld to Afferde near Hameln.
3. 18 June–20 August: **Battle of Kolin (18 June)**. Frederick suffers his first defeat and the Prussians withdraw from Bohemia. The Austrians pursue.
4. 5 July: Memel falls to the Russians under General Fermor. The Russians garrison the town and rejoin Apraxin.
5. 8 July: Contades is detached to Kassel but rejoins d'Estrees as he marches after Cumberland.
6. 26 July: **Battle of Hastenbeck**. After a close fought battle Cumberland is defeated by d'Estrees and withdraws north.
7. 26 July–23 August: The Hanoverians withdraw through Nienburg, Verden (8 August) and on to Stade (23 August).
8. 3 August–8 September: The Duke de Richelieu takes over command of French forces on 3 August. On 20 August the French advance to Stade. Cumberland proposes a cessation of hostilities. Treaty of Kloster Zeven signed on 8 September.
9. 25 August: French and Reichsarmee concentrate at Erfurt.
10. 25 August: Frederick leaves Lusatia via Bautzen and Dresden to deal with the threat of the Franco-Reichsarmee concentrating in Saxony.
11. 30 August: **Battle of Gross-Jagersdorf**. General Lewaldt attacks the Russians under Apraxin but is defeated. Russians retire to Tilst and then to Memel.
12. 3 September: Lewaldt marches across Pomerania and drives the Swedes out of Demmin and Anklan, back into Stralsund.
13. 13 September: Frederick arrives in Erfurt; Soubise withdraws to Gotha.
14. 14 September: Ferdinand of Brunswick is dispatched to Halberstadt to cover any advances by the French. Prince Moritz is sent to Torgau to watch for any Austrian advances on Berlin.
15. 15–16 September: Frederick arrives in Gotha; Soubise retires to Eisenach.
16. 16 September: Frederick moves back to Erfurt.
17. 18 September: Bevern arrives in Leignitz to cover Silesia.
18. 20–29 September: Duke de Richelieu marches from Stade via Brunswick and arrives in Halberstadt on 29 September. Ferdinand of Brunswick withdraws to Magdeburg.
19. 27 September: Frederick goes back to Büttelstädt.
20. 30 September: Soubise advances to Gotha, but no further.
