

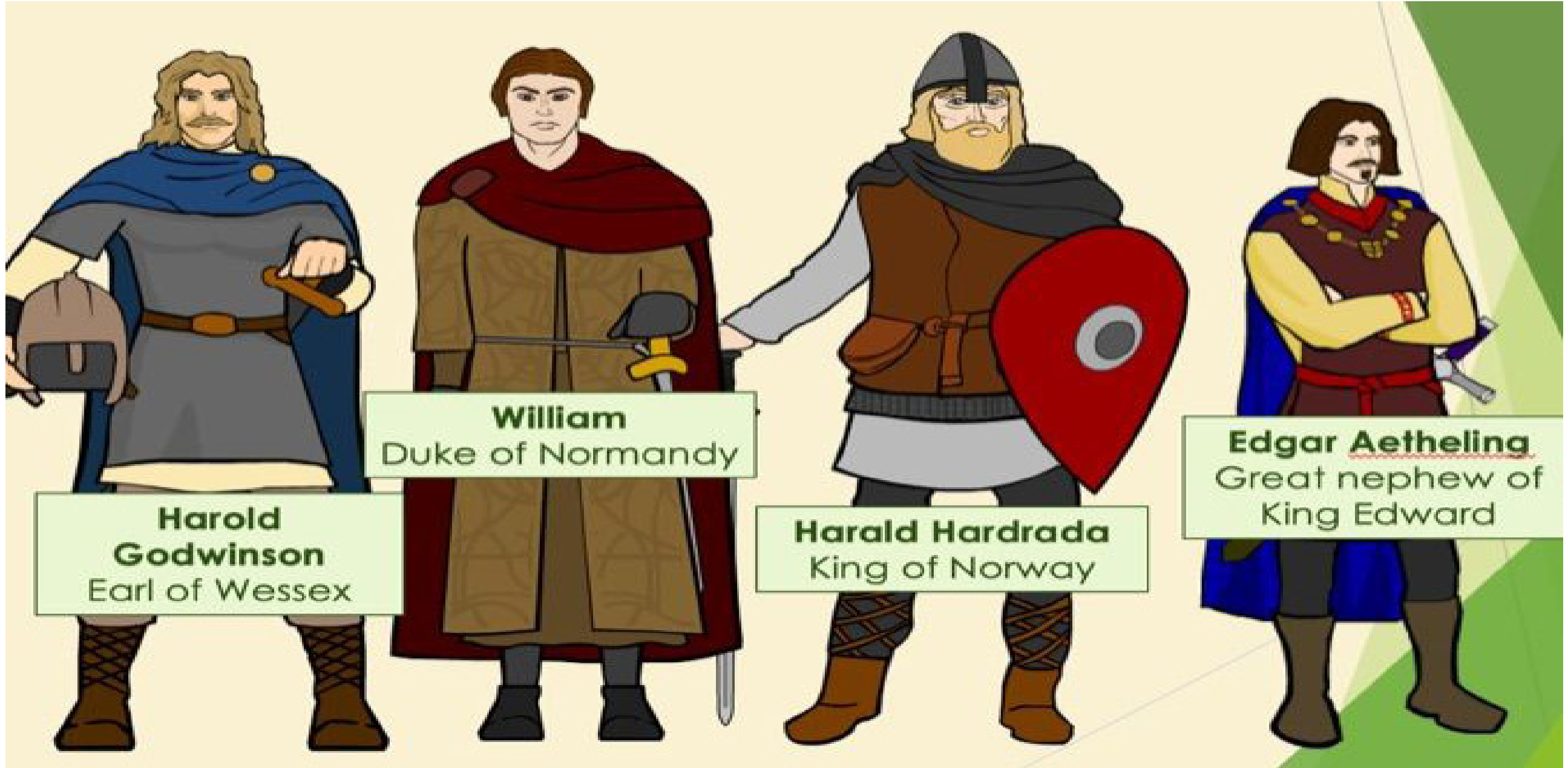

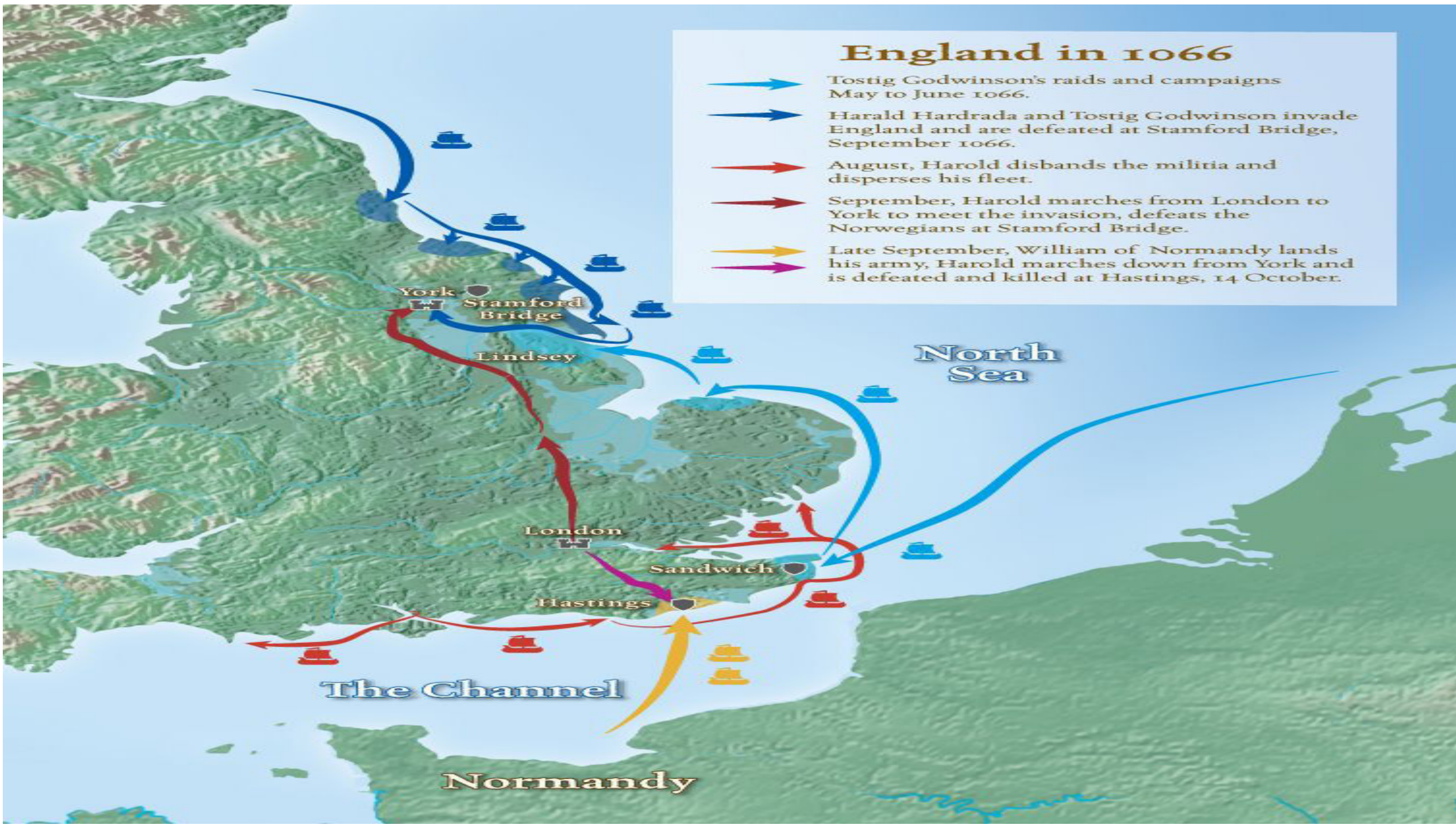

### England in 1066

-  Tostig Godwinson's raids and campaigns May to June 1066.
-  Harald Hardrada and Tostig Godwinson invade England and are defeated at Stamford Bridge, September 1066.
-  August, Harold disbands the militia and disperses his fleet.
-  September, Harold marches from London to York to meet the invasion, defeats the Norwegians at Stamford Bridge.
-  Late September, William of Normandy lands his army, Harold marches down from York and is defeated and killed at Hastings, 14 October.

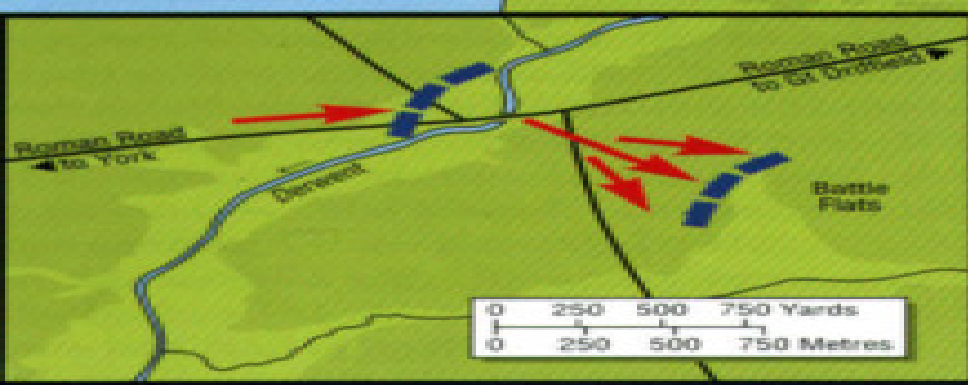

### Battle of Stamford Bridge



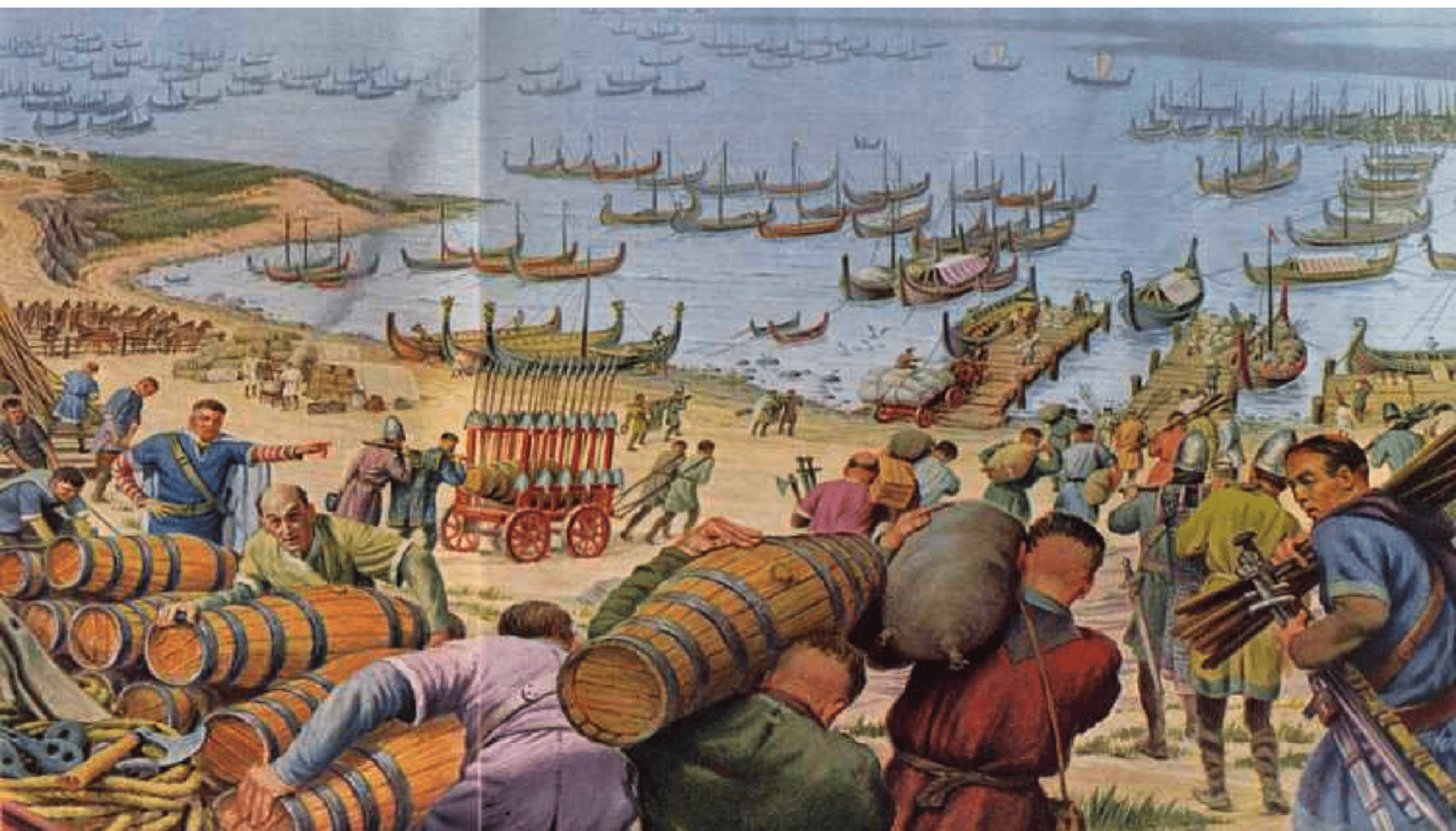
William's movement of the Fleet: Musters on 4 or 5 August. Moves on 12 September possibly taking 2 days because of shipwrecks.

Probably 27-28 Sept

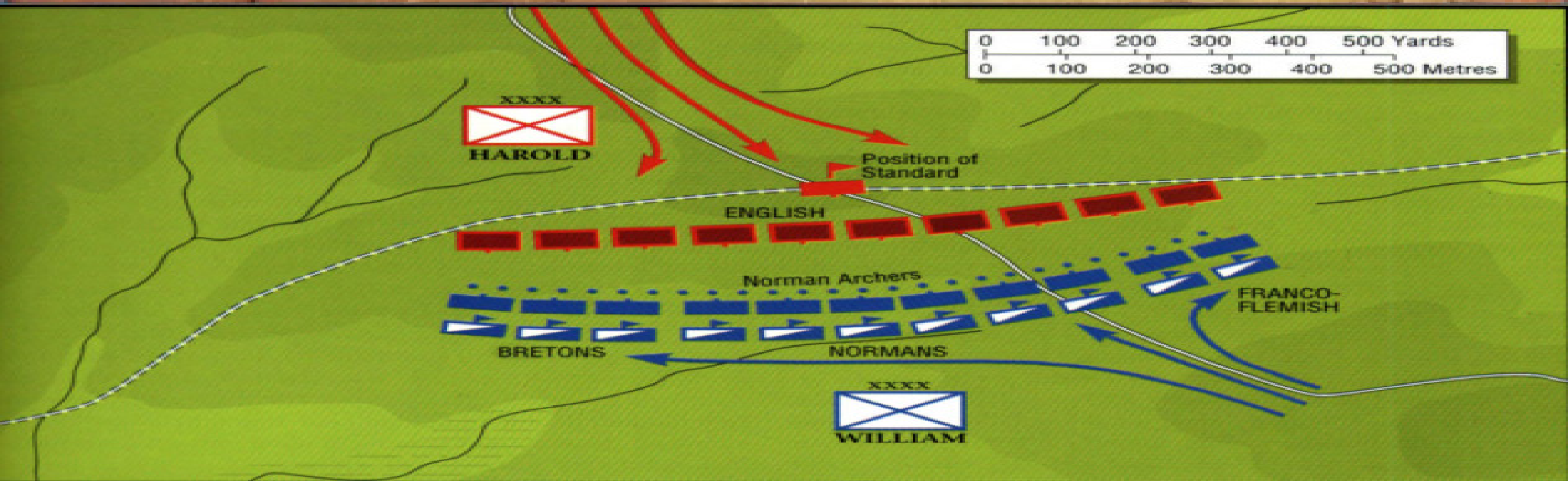


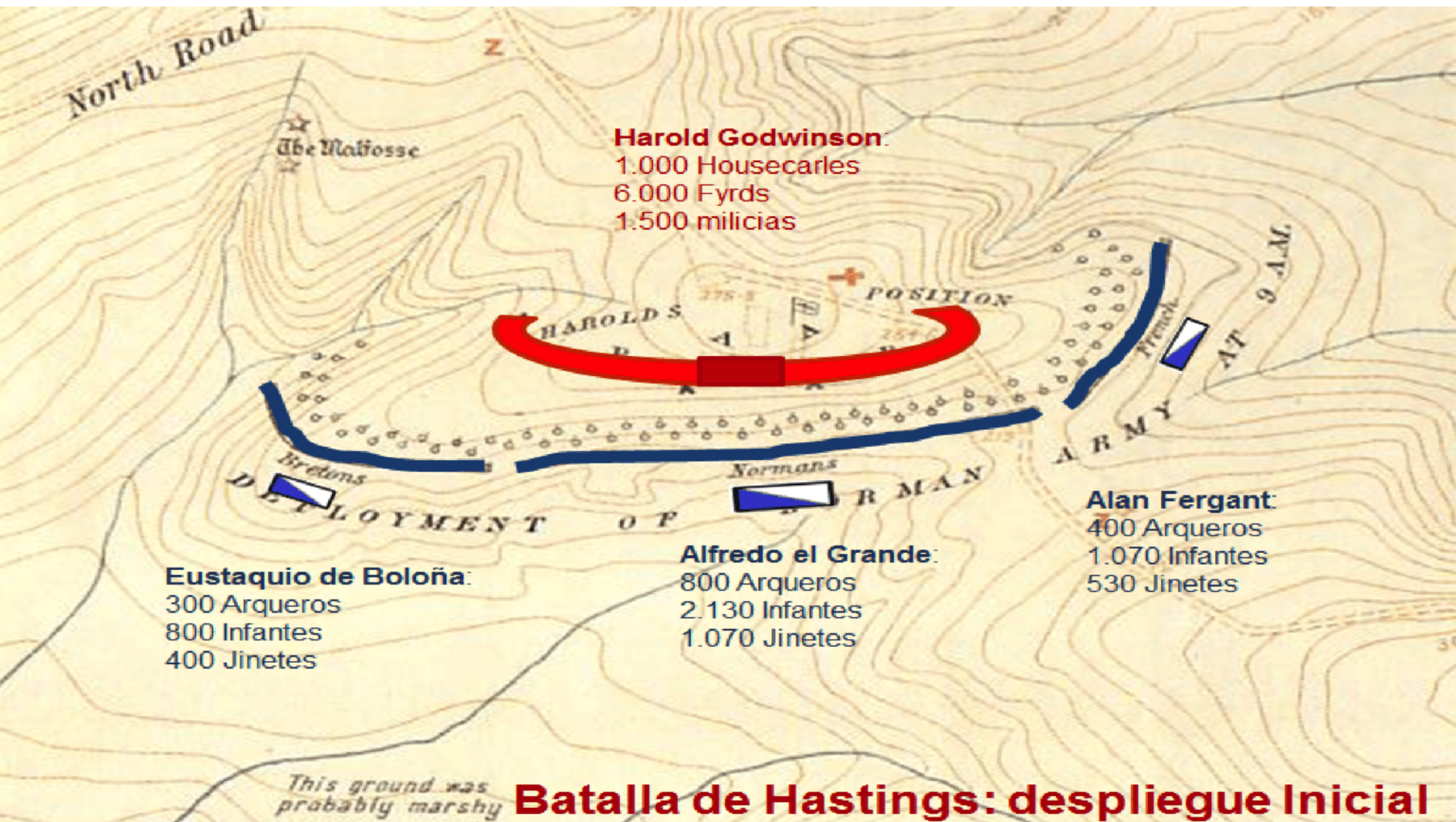

**The Norman Conquest of England**

- borders in 1066
- Normandy in 1066
- Norman conquests 1066–70
- under Norman control by 1100
- original grant to Rollo, 911

- William the Conqueror's invasion 1066
- William's campaigns 1069–70
- main areas of English resistance to the Normans 1168–70
- principal English castles built or sanctioned by William the Conqueror
- English and Norman bishoprics in 1066
- important Norman abbeys

last English resistance under Hereward the Wake quelled, summer 1071
